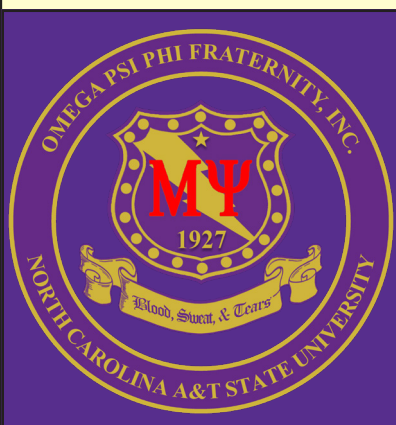


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Greetings Brothers,

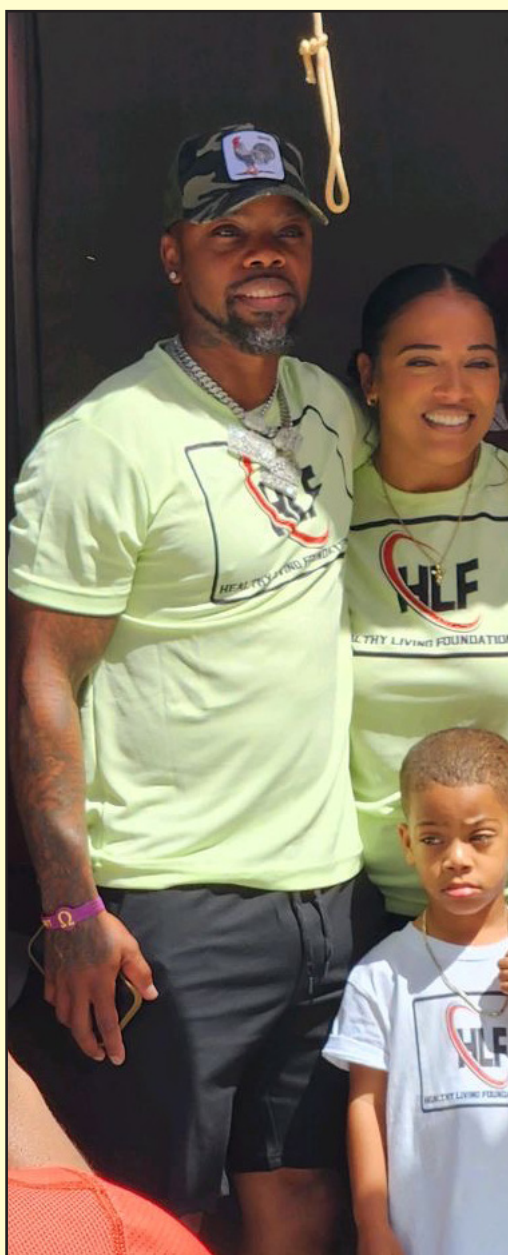

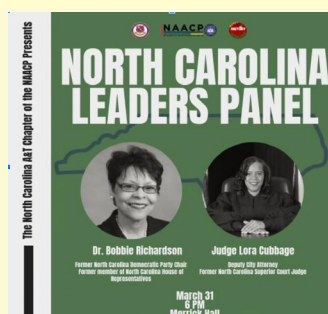

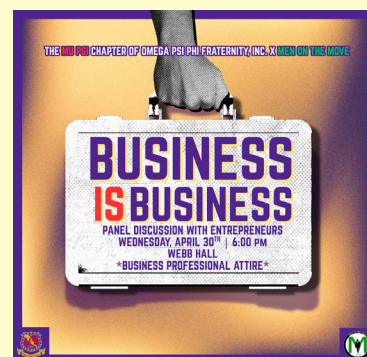


'What's Next?' Program (Diversity & Inclusion)

- Guest speaker: Ms. Ja'Net Adams - Financial Literacy Coach for Higher Ed

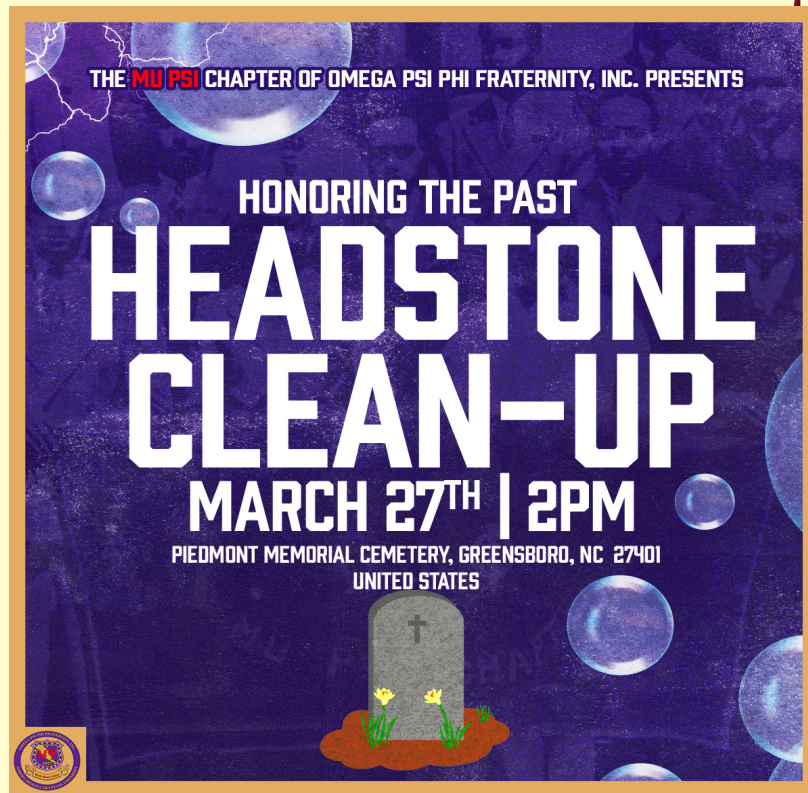


It's All Mental
